

## The Three "A's" of Compulsive Behavior

The word "addiction" can often be confusing for many people. The three most common words related to it that often make it so misunderstood are "addicted", "addictive", and the word "addiction" itself.

Separating them out, the word "addictive" is probably the most widely misunderstood term. Any behavior that appears to be excessive is many times regarded as "addictive". You may hear someone say, "Your exercise program is becoming addictive", or "You'd better be eareful how many french fries or peanuts you eat because they are becoming addictive."

And we've all heard of the so-called "workaholic," a person who seems to be "addicted" to their job or employment. But jobs aren't really "addictive." Many people simply use their employment as a way of ignoring other things in their life they'd rather not do or responsibilities they'd rather not meet.

In the treatment world, "addiction" is defined as a condition or disease one has regardless of the substances or activity involved. For example, an individual who compulsively drinks alcohol has a chemical addiction; an individual who cats compulsively has a food addiction, an individual who compulsively gambles or spends has an addiction, either to the excitement and rush of gambling or to the money itself.

There are other factors involved in the diagnosis of a disease, but the person who engages in compulsive behaviors such as these has been diagnosed with the disease of "addiction" and is identified as "addicted." According to the American Society of Addiction Medicine, "addiction" is, ultimately, "a primary chronic disease of brain reward, motivation, memory and related circuitry. Dysfunction of these circuits leads to characteristic biological, psychological, social and spiritual manifestations. This is reflected in an individual pathologically pursuing reward and/or by substance use and other behaviors.

Addiction is characterized by the inability to consistently abstain, the impairment in behavioral control, craving, diminished recognition of significant problems with one's behaviors and interpersonal relationships, and a dysfunctional emotional response.

Like other chronic diseases, addiction often involves cycles of relapse and remission. Without treatment or engagement in recovery activities, addiction is progressive and can result in disability or premature death.

To summarize, the three "A's" of compulsive behavior in the treatment setting mean:

- addiction is a clinically diagnosed disease.
- addicted is what you are when you have the disease
- addictive is a term used both medically and non-medically and too often very inaccurately.

#### What Is the Foundation?
