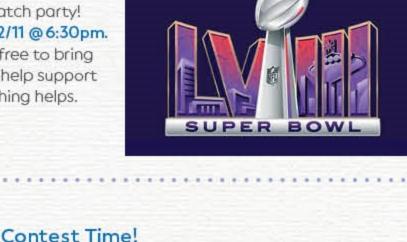




It will take place at Willingway on 2/11 @ 6:30pm. Food will be provided. Please feel free to bring

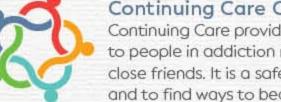
